SATURDAY SCHOLARS CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Students will attend the same class from 9:30 am to 12 pm on all three Saturdays on the campus of Hopkinsville Community College. Please note that each class is offered for a specific grade level. Content areas are indicated at the end of each class description. AR = Art, LA = Language Arts, MA = Math, SC = Science, SS = Social Studies.

#1 MAGNIFICENT MATH (grades 1-2)

Experiment with 2D and 3D shapes and try some creative hands-on activities to learn more about math without using a pencil and paper! You will be having so much fun that you will forget you are actually learning about math! Taught by Jennifer Jatczak. MA

#2 WONDERFUL WEATHER (grades 1-2)

Sun, wind, rain, or snow – weather affects you wherever you go! Investigate different types of weather and find out why weather happens the way it does. Learn how to predict weather forecasts like professional meteorologists and even create your own weather effects! Taught by Brett Pritchett. SC

#3 YOUNG MASTERS (grades 1-2)

Discover some of the world's most famous artists and then create your own masterpieces using techniques perfected by impressionist painters from the 1800s. Find out what to look for when you visit an art museum and learn to be a junior art critic. Taught by Amanda Kirves. AR

#4 FOOD, FUN, AND FRACTIONS (grades 1-2)

Let's get cooking! Use your math skills to create delicious dishes in this hands-on class all about fractions. Learn how fractions are used in the kitchen and put your skills to the test as you whip up something tasty every week. Taught by Sara Yeager. MA

#5 PRESENT LIKE A PRO (grades 3-4)

Find out how to overcome those butterflies in your stomach and actually enjoy speaking in front of a group! Learn to choose a writing style that fits you best and practice your listening skills during your classmates' superb speeches. Taught by Mia Farrell. LA

#6 ¡MÁS, POR FAVOR! (grades 3-4)

You've learned Spanish words from Dora and Sesame Street, but can you have a conversation in Spanish? Develop your Spanish vocabulary to include letters, numbers, shapes, colors, weather, and time! Go home saying "¡Mi maestro está loco loco loco!" Taught by Alfonso de Torres. LA

#7 WONDROUS WORKS (grades 3-4)

Get your passports ready! Take a journey through the human body to find out how your diet and eating habits affect your digestion and nutrition. Discuss digestive disorders and learn how good nutrition and exercise can lead to good health. Taught by Crystal Boozer. SC

#8 AMERICAN CIVIL WAR (grades 5-6)

See what it was like to be a soldier in the Civil War. Learn about clothing, battle weapons and tactics, and witness a battle reenactment. Understand what made their days difficult and find out what they did for entertainment. This is a history lesson you will never forget! Taught by George Copeland. SS

#9 CSI: THE REAL STORY (grades 5-6)

The real world of criminal investigation is not like what you see on TV. Discover real life identification practices including body style, fingerprints, and DNA and find out how a criminal investigation unfolds. Taught by Greg Bridgeman. SC

#10 BUILDING BRIDGES (grades 5-6)

From inception to construction, apply real-world math concepts to build a bridge. Use your knowledge of math to design the bridge, then construct a model and propose your idea to the city council. Will the council approve your project? Come find out! Taught by Scott Blackerby. MA • SC

#11 FUN WITH CAD (grades 7-8)

Explore the practical uses of interactive computer graphics. Using a computer-aided design (CAD) program, experiment with construction and editing tools, create orthographic and multiview drawings, and practice with basic dimensioning and 3D drawing tools. Taught by Reggie Akpom. MA • SC

#12 CRAZY CONTRAPTIONS (grades 7-8)

Experiment with simple machines and understand the math that makes them work. Design a series of devices to work together to perform a task. Build, test, and tweak your devices to make them perfect. Taught by Jason Wilson. MA • SC

#13 GOT DIRT? DISCOVER AG! (grades 7-8)

Climb aboard a modern farm vehicle to see how agriculture has changed. Find out how farmers use the Global Positioning System (GPS) and learn to take soil samples. Consider the farms of yesterday to understand how agriculture is changing our future. Taught by Robbie Alexander. SC

#14 PAPER ART (grades 7-8)

Explore 3D paper art including origami pop-ups, traditional pop-ups, and basic packaging. Examine the origins of paper art and study its evolution from 6th century Japan to today's Smithsonian Museum. Create your own paper art, collaborate with your classmates and consider ways to develop your masterpiece. Taught by Charles Sims. AR • MA

Summary of Coverage

Insurance Carrier: United States Fire Insurance Company

Coverage: Insurance coverage is on an **excess** basis only. The participants' personal health insurance policy will be primary and provide coverage for accident. The **excess** policy will cover any out-of-pocket expense not paid by the participants' personal insurance up to the limits of the policy listed below. (This includes payment of the deductible and co-insurance amounts if applied under the participants' personal policy.) The benefit period is one year. The first expense must be incurred within 30 days of the accident. If the participant does not have personal health insurance coverage, this **excess** policy will first dollar, up to the limits of this policy. Sickness is not covered. Also, pre-existing conditions are not covered. A pre-existing condition is any condition for which a prudent person should have sought treatment or was treated in the previous six months.
